F. Scott Fitzgerald was born in 1896 in St Paul, Minnesota, and went to Princeton University, which he left in 1917 to join the army. He was said to have epitomized the Jazz Age, which he himself defined as “a generation grown up to find all Gods dead, all wars fought, all faiths in man shaken.” Seinen Vornamen Francis erhielt Fitzgerald zu Ehren seines Urgroßonkels Francis Scott Key, des Dichters der US-amerikanischen Nationalhymne.
